News From China Connect



This is part of our chinaconnect teaching team.....The Family of Christ Connection! Three former FOC members volunteered as summer English camp teachers: Karen Bilter with her husband, Jim Saltness, and Sally and Joe Aalbue.

Our schedule was grueling, but we fell in love with our students almost immediately. That made it all worth it. We worked with 28 college English teachers and about 90 college students. All wanted to improve their oral English through lots of practice. They attended four classes a day and joined the casual English corner in the evening. Not only did their English improve, but connections and relationships were formed. The teachers formed a group on qq (like Facebook) and the students plan to stick together. They told us they learned about passion, family, respect, bravery, boldness, family and love. They are the future of China and they know it. They want a peaceful world where our countries can be the leaders who make that happen.

After our camp finished, we visited the countryside where china**connect** supports four schools. It was heart-wrenching to see the conditions in which folks live, but our small efforts are making a difference. China**connect** believes they can be a model for what is possible so other small groups can pick up the idea and pass it on. So many Americans believe China is rich....There absolutely are rich, very rich people in China, but like America, there are the poor. Unfortunately, in China, that's 80% of the people.


The recent influx of unaccompanied children arriving in the U.S. is a result of risk factors causing them to leave their home countries. The children's countries of origin

are aggravated by lack of protection from drug trafficking and poverty, among many other factors.

We believe in protecting and caring for those who are most vulnerable by providing services to ensure their safety, upholding their human rights and recognizing and preventing risks of exploitation.

Working with our global companions and strategic allies such as Lutheran Immigration and Refugee Services, Lutheran Disaster Response is committed to walking with unaccompanied and migrant children within the United States and across borders.

Gifts designated for Unaccompanied and Migrant Children through Lutheran Disaster Response will be used in full (100 percent) to help support efforts that will uphold the rights of those displaced.
