Pastor's Reflection

Comfort, O comfort my people, says your God. Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that she has served her term, that her penalty is paid, that she has received from the LORD's hand double for all her sins. A voice cries out: "In the wilderness prepare the way of the LORD, make straight in the desert a highway for our God. Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain. Then the glory of the LORD shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together, for the mouth of the LORD has spoken." Isaiah 40:1-5

"Hope you make it." Gavin

As I write this brief article, there is a tenuous cease fire in Gaza, ISIS is tearing the fabric of the Middle East Russia and apart. the Ukraine are in conflict, Syria is a mess, Ebola is claiming the lives of thousands in West Africa, the death of Michael Brown has Ferguson in chaos, and Robin Williams has succumbed to the specter of depression. These are tough times. As I was reading the news on the internet, I felt my heart growing heavy, until I ran across the story of Gavin and the gift he gave to our troops serving in Kabul. It wasn't an extravagant gift. It was something more precious than that. Gavin gave them the gift of hope in a simple card sent to an undesignated soldier in a care package prepared by his elementary school. Inside the card were the simple words, "Hope you make it." Here's a short excerpt from




the article (I encourage you to Google it and read the whole thing!)

Young Gavin's four words — "Hope you make it" — show him to be "wise beyond his years," Papworth writes. "He wished me well - while being slightly realistic about the role I lived as a deployed member of our expeditionary military service, I may not make it, but he hopes I do. That is a profound comfort from a presumed grade schooler."

Gavin's words are not at all unlike Isaiah's words to the people of Israel suffering in exile. Isaiah's words are



Summer Mission Partner



Ebola Outbreak

The deadly Ebola virus appeared in the West African country of Guinea early in 2014 and has now spread to Liberia, Nigeria and Sierra Leone. The disease had been unknown in that region until then. On Aug. 4, the World Health Organization reported at least 1,700 cases with more than 900 deaths, making it the deadliest outbreak of the disease in recorded history.

Our Response: Lutheran Disaster Response is committed to walking with our brothers and sisters affected by the Ebola outbreak in West Africa. Operating through our partners and our companion churches, we are supplying and shipping by air essential protective gear and supplies to protect medical workers at Phebe Hospital and Curran Lutheran Hospital in Liberia. Bible study is offered each week to anyone who wants to come and a counselor from Community Service Northwest stops by to visit with folks, drinking coffee each morning in the garage and in the driveway. It's a very busy place to visit. Dave and I go down each Wednesday morning to bring snacks and socks, so if any of you want to go along, we'd love to take you with us.

This week we held a men's "spa" night with foot soaking for "tired tootsies", clean socks, and cheese cake thanks to a donation from Debbie Broers' son. There were about 15 men soaking feet all evening and for just a little while, relaxing and almost forgetting the cares of the day. We gave out lots of clean socks, shirts, and underwear from those we've had donated. If you can contribute to these items, they are always needed and welcomed. We use a lot of black crew socks and white crew socks.

Our Sunday night street dinners have increased to 4 stops downtown serving between 40-60 people. The folks love getting milk and orange juice as well as a full hot dinner so if you would like to help with items, we can always use hot dishes, salads, milk, or juice. We use about 2 gallons of each per Sunday.

We are making many friendships and can count 125 names of people we know on the street. If you'd like to join us some Sunday night, please let me know. God is good and so is life.
