Pastor's Reflection

Blessed are the poor in spirit, for there is the kingdom of heaven...

Matthew 5

The crisp air and colors of autumn are slowly slipping into the chill of the winter months here in the Pacific North West. We are blessed to get to live in an area where the beauty and splendor of God's creation are so vibrant, and the passing of time so beautifully punctuated by changing of seasons. There is a gentle and determined rhythm to the change. If you have the leisure to enjoy it, the slow regular changing of the seasons is down right comforting. However, for those who are out in the cold these changes are anything but comforting. The challenges of poverty, lack of affordable housing, and hunger seem somehow more profound when the weather turns cold. For those left outside, survival becomes about finding a warm safe corner. That's why the ministry of the WHO (Winter Hospitality Overflow) is so very important. It provides safety and warmth—a place out of the cold.

People of God, during these months I am continuously and especially reminded of the depth of heart of all of the family at Family of Christ. You inspire me. I'm encouraged by the partnership we share with other



faith communities that have joined together to make providing that safe warm place their mission. Yes, WHO is only temporary, and it is true that it is not the solution to the larger problem, but on a cold bitter night, it is life.

At Family we have been blessed in many ways and we know blessings are meant to be shared. In our Vision Statement we use the words; Connecting the scriptures, Serving and Caring, Building, Transforming, and Moving purposefully to guide us in seeking the ways we can live that love out together. We understand ourselves as called, gathered and sent by Jesus into the world to embody a certain kind of love—the love of God that leaves no one behind.

Love and a fervent faith that Jesus can take what we do and use it to heal and bring life is all the reason we need to get out there, to do what we do. So, this winter we will staff the WHO, fill 100 holiday food boxes, and provide Christmas to 100 children in need. That's why we've made dignity bags for foster children a mission. That's why we Friends volunteer at of Carpenter, and help provide food for Dave and Judy to take out in the back of a truck into the homeless camps.

Thank you good and faithful servants of God. Through Christ Jesus our Lord, let the People of God say, Amen.

What is Imagine?



The *Imagine renewal* covenant we entered into last December is a process and a spiritual journey that we take together. We committed

ourselves to engage in intentional prayer, bible study, reflection, and conversation around our call as a congregation and the ministry we share, centered on the question, "What is God calling us to now?"

Writing a **Vision Statement** is usually part of the process, but we were ahead on that one—we will be making even greater use of our Vision Statement in the months to come.

There is behind the scenes work like ensuring our financial house is in order, and looking at our outreach to the community via social and online media and printed materials and ensuring that our ministries and programs truly reflect our mission and vision statements. I can tell you that work is ongoing.

Acts devotions invite us into reflection with the earliest Christians, to learn from them as we ask, "What is God calling us to now?" Of course, that means we also need to be listening to the Spirit and talking about it!

What's Next?

On November 3rd, our Imagine Team will attend the 4th training workshop. Listening plays a big role in Imagine. Our pastor, council, and Imagine team want to hear from you. Please share your thoughts, dreams and ideas. In the spring, we will do a congregation vitality survey to see how we as a congregation feel we are doing.

How can you be a part of Imagine? It's easy!

- *Pray* for: our brothers and sisters here at FOC, ask the Holy Spirit to fill us with passion for the gospel and the ministry we share. Pray for God to grow God's Church here and throughout the world.
- **Participate** in the worship and life of the congregation. We need each other! Hebrews 10:25 urges us to "not neglect to meet together." The earlies Christians relied on the strength found in a community that gathers, and from there they changed the world. That's still how it works!
- *Listen and share*. Making a sacred space to listen to the stories of others and to share our faith/life stories has amazing power to bless! Oh I know that one is hard. Our culture has trained us out of faith conversations. Truth is, that's not a good thing on many levels. Creating space where folks can share and be listened to honors their humanity. Sharing our stories can inspire others and help us dig deeper too, so don't be shy. It's a win win!
- *Invite* your neighbors, friends and family. There are many reasons a person will enter a church building. Some are seeking help or a place to find comfort, others a community of mutual values and belief, and still others may simply be lonely. More often than not, folks come because they were invited. It's always ok to invite. We have wonderful introductory materials to help you share about FOC.
- Support the ministry we share with your presence, time, talents and treasure as you are able.

What ever we do in word or in deed, let us do everything in the name of Jesus Christ, and let our holy imaginations roll with the Holy Spirit's fire.


Pack & Deliver

Turkey Time is Almost Here

One of our traditions at Family is gathering turkeys and all the trimmings for a Christmas dinner for needy families.



We begin by getting names of families from 4 local schools. Next, we ask our congregation to watch for specials on turkeys, usually a week or two before Thanksgiving. When you have your bird, bring it to church and sign the sheet on top of our freezer in the Family Room. That way we have an inventory of turkeys since our goal is 100, 25 per school.

Our shelves go up in the Family Room early in November so you can see what goes into the dinner box. We ask that you stay within our suggestions so all boxes are uniform in content.

On Saturday, December 16 at 9 a.m. anyone who wants to pack the dinner boxes should meet at the Family Room. Then on Sunday, the 17th after second service, we will meet to divide up and deliver the turkeys and dinner boxes. This is a wonderful holiday activity, one that we hope will become a tradition for your family.

The Winter Hospitality Overflow or WHO is opening November 1 at St. Andrew and St. Paul Lutheran churches.

This is the 15th year of operation and once again, I'm asking for your help volunteering at these wonderful places.

We will partner again with All Saints Episcopal and Bethel Lutheran so that means we have only a few shifts to fill for Family of Christ.

Our dates at St. Andrew family shelter will be Friday morning, Dec.1 through Sunday morning, December 3. That's only 7 shifts and only 2 overnights.

There are many families with children able to stay warm and safe because of your generosity in helping take care of them.

The sign-up sheet is on the wall next to the kitchen door in the hall. Be sure to check your calendar and sign up early to get your favorite spot. You'll get a reminder call the days before your shift. We'll also need food for our shifts so a sign-up sheet will go up for that also.

- St. Paul has a bed capacity of 24 for single men.
- Each WHO shelter is staffed with professional Share case managers who help guests work toward self-sufficiency.
- More than 50 faith congregations and community organizations have donated time and talent to ensure each WHO site is open for five full months!
